A champion works as a catalyst with neighbours, colleagues or a school group. A champion helps the group take joint responsibility for caring for their adopted stretch.

### Check your area

It is important to monitor the state of your stretch/area on an ongoing basis. The KCC provides information & materials to support your auditing activities.

### Do your bit

Combined efforts to improve the health of our catchment are vital. Educate yourself & your group. Approach people who dump waste to discuss better alternatives. Keep your area free of invasive alien plants.<sup>1</sup> Alert the Municipality to issues like sewage leaks. Promote care, consequential thinking & responsible actions.
